Fire Chief Warns Drivers Must Obey Traffic Regulations

Motorists must obey the traffic law requiring the driver of a car to pull to the side of the road and stop whenever a fire truck approaches blowing a siren, Fire Chief John D. Cotton said today.

Another point for motorists to remember, the Chief said, is that they are not to follow closely behind a fire truck while it is en route to a fire. The state law requires motorists to remain at least 500 feet behind any fire fighting apparatus.
